

Following Root Canal Treatment

- 1. The tooth may be sore to chewing and you may experience a mild to moderate ache around the tooth for a few days or longer. Try Ibuprofen, Aspirin or Tylenol to control any discomfort. This usually subsides after a few days following treatment. If the discomfort is severe, if you notice any swelling, or if you develop a fever, please call our office.
- 2. Most patients can have some discomfort for two or three days following root canal treatment. The amount of discomfort can vary with procedures and each individual patient.
- 3. You will feel a great relief of symptoms if you had an abscessed tooth to begin with.
- 4. You should feel no more hot/cold sensitivity, although the tooth might be sore to biting.
- 5. If the tooth is a back molar or premolar and not yet crowned, we usually recommend that you have the tooth crowned. Front teeth like canines and incisors do not have as great of a potential for cracking or splitting with normal use, therefore those teeth do not often need to be followed with a crown.
